Press Release June 27, 2023 Re: Recovery from Tornado Damage from June 25, 2023

Citizens affected by the storms of June 25, 2023 may register at <u>https://in211.communityos.org</u> and then follow the DAMAGE REPORTING tab at the top of the webpage to request assistance through this portal. Citizens may also contact the Johnson County Emergency Management directly at 317.346.4655.

Johnson County Government will be providing curbside pick up of woody debris (trees, shrubs, bushes) starting over the next few days. Citizens are instructed to place woody debris by their curb or at the edge of the road, but not in the roadway. This woody debris <u>must be separated</u> from general construction and non-woody debris in order for it to be picked up. Citizens do not need to register online for curbside pickup of woody debris. County forces will not enter private property to remove woody debris.

Johnson County Government will also provide dumpsters over the next few days which will be placed in areas affected by the storms of June 25, 2023. Citizens are responsible for taking the general construction and non-woody debris to those dumpsters. Johnson County will not pick up this type of debris from the curb. Citizens should not put woody debris in dumpsters. Johnson County will provide specific locations in a subsequent press release.

Electronics are not allowed to be placed in the dumpsters. Citizens should contact Johnson County Recycling District at 317.738.2546 regarding electronics.
